Coordinate coalition support for the Asia-Pacific Economic Cooperation (APEC) meeting on November 10-12, 2011 (Clairmont).</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Designated a National Special Security Event (NSSE). • 21 heads of state and up to 20,000 delegates attending. • Requires intensive preparation, training and coordination with federal, state and county agencies. <p>II. Implement Everbridge Aware® emergency notification system by June 1, 2011 (Richter).</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Subscribe up to 10,000 users among all 115 coalition organizations including all hospitals, subacutes, Community Health Centers, home care and hospice providers, air and ground ambulance providers, Hawaii DMAT (Kalawao Rescue) and clinical laboratories and blood banks. <p>III. Deploy Enhanced WebEOC application system functionality by September 30, 2011 (Clairmont).</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Add new and enhanced functionality for patient (casualty) demand, resource status (personnel, supply and equipment), and system status (utilities, medical gases, imaging, clinical laboratory, blood products, and related). • Add geospatial capabilities to manage the locations of ACM's, response teams, major assets. • Invite participation of Pacific area healthcare organizations. • Relocate computer workstations to Hospital Command Centers.

Continue to add new field-deployable capabilities by July 30, 2011 (Clairmont).</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Minor surgical suite – lighting, instruments, anesthesia. • Liquid oxygen convertors with associated gaseous oxygen distribution systems. • Portable primary care pharmacy.

Install a VHF-FM HealthComm repeater at Lanai Community Hospital by March 1, 2011 (Aronoff).</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Improve propagation for Maui County.
